AMERICAN HELLENIC EDUCATIONAL PROGRESSIVE ASSOCIATION

Last year, AHEPA distributed 25 scholarships totaling \$23,000 to eligible students. Applicant must:

- Be a high school senior
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better
- Be of Greek heritage or have a parent that is an active member of AHEPA
- Plan to attend an accredited college or university in the fall of 2007

FURMAN UNIVERSITY – Greenville, South Carolina

Furman University is accepting nominations for the 2008 Furman Scholars program. Criteria are:

- Unweighted GPA of 3.75 or higher, or weighted GPA of 4.0 or higher
- Rank in the top 5% of class
- PSAT score of 135 or higher, SAT of 1350 or higher, or ACT of 30 or higher
- Interested in an education in the Liberal Arts and Sciences

Up to four **Juniors** from OPRF may be nominated. All Furman Scholars that are accepted for admission will receive a minimum of \$5,000, renewable yearly upon maintaining a 3.0 GPA. Furman Scholars may also compete for other scholarships, including the prestigious *Herman W. Lay Scholarship*, valued at \$170,000 over four years for full tuition, room and board. **Interested Juniors must see their Counselor to request nomination.** More information about Furman University can be found at the website www.engagefurman.com.

Student must also provide two letters of recommendation (one from a teacher and one from applicant's counselor), most recent high school transcript showing ACT/SAT scores, and a black and white photo. Deadline: Received no later than May 15, 2008

This award of \$2,000 will be given to a **female high school senior** with a GPA of 3.75 or higher and who has at least one parent of Italian ancestry. Student must also provide two letters of recommendation (one from a teacher and one from applicant's counselor), most recent high school transcript showing ACT/SAT scores, and a small photo.
